strategy rules.

Never take insurance or "even money."

If there is no row for splitting

(fives and tens), then look up your hand as a hard total (1) Tj T* BT /F

If you can't split

because of a limit on re-splitting, then look up your hand

as a hard total, except

aces. In the extremely unlikely event you have a pair of aces

; you can't re-split and

drawing to split aces is allowed, then double against a 6, otherwise h

it.

If you play a

mixture of six-deck games, some where the dealer hits a soft

17, and some where he

stands, and you only wish to memorize one strategy, I would

recommend you memorize the

one where the dealer stands on soft 17. The cost in errors

due to playing the wrong

strategy is 2.3 times higher playing a stand on soft 17 game,

with the hit on 17

strategy, than vice versa.

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
